The University adopts a progressive stance on gender empowerment, offering equal opportunities to women. Women occupy several key leadership roles, including Registrar and Dean positions. The Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell addresses grievances, and the Women's Study Centre offers specialized courses and works for community betterment in adopted villages.

Human values are embedded in programs focusing on social responsibility and ethical practices. Activities like visits to old-age homes, blood donation drives, and cleanliness campaigns foster empathy and community engagement. The inclusion of Drug Abuse as a subject and the appointment of buddy coordinators provide moral support and counseling to students. A Universal Human Values Cell further supports these efforts.

Environmental awareness is promoted through a mandatory Environment Studies course in UG programs and topics like biodiversity, pollution, and disaster management. These initiatives prepare students to address societal challenges with responsibility and ethical awareness.

The University employs an outcome-based education model, emphasizing performance-oriented learning. Each program has Programme Educational Objectives (PEOs) aligned with the institution's vision, statutory councils, and stakeholder expectations. Course Outcomes (COs) are mapped to Programme Outcomes

Course Outcomes (CO) and Program Outcomes (PO) are assessed to track and improve students' performance. CO-PO attainment is a key tool for enhancing learning and teaching strategies, with target levels set by departments or based on past performance trends.

**CO Assessment Process:** CO attainment is evaluated using a weighted formula: 25% from continuous internal assessments (assignments, tests) and 75% from semester examinations. Students who fail can reappear to improve their performance.

**PO and PSO Assessment:** Assessment employs direct methods (tests,

assignments, practicals) and indirect methods (stakeholder surveys on graduates' skills). PO attainment is categorized into distinction, first division, pass, and fail, based on course averages and survey feedback.

**Examples and Outcomes:** CO and PO results guide corrective measures and remedial actions. Placement success in fields like pharmacy (manufacturing, research) and physiotherapy (specialized hospitals) reflects PO attainment. Outstanding students are recognized with gold medals or Chancellor's awards.

This structured evaluation ensures continuous improvement in educational processes and student performance, aligning with industry and academic standards.

### 3.3 - Innovation Ecosystem

3.3.1 - Institution has created an eco-system for innovations including Incubation centre and other initiatives for creation and transfer of knowledge

The Entrepreneurship, Innovation, and Career Hub (EICH) at Punjabi University, Patiala, established under Rashtriya Uchchar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA), Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, plays a pivotal role in developing an ecosystem for entrepreneurship through education and skill development. With a focus on promoting rural entrepreneurship, EICH aims to build a financially, socially, and environmentally sustainable ecosystem. By engaging various stakeholders, the hub identifies niche areas requiring specific technologies, products, or services, extending its impact into remote rural regions through the university's regional entities.

EICH is structured around three key verticals: entrepreneurship-centric education, skill development, and incubation. To support these efforts, the Centre for Rural Entrepreneurship and Skill Training (CREST) has been established as an incubation center to orient students and aspiring entrepreneurs toward rural start-ups. Six priority domains have been identified: Agri-food, Medicine, Information Technology, Finance, Physical Sciences and IoT, and Rural Tourism and Artefacts.

These initiatives have been successful in orienting students towards entrepreneurship and fostering an ecosystem that nurtures innovation. In line with the vision of imparting skills for promoting rural entrepreneurship, a 6-month Diploma in Entrepreneurship has been proposed and its outline has already been submitted. This would further strengthen the university's commitment to sustainable rural development and empowerment.

### 3.6 - Extension Activities

3.6.1 - Extension activities in the neighbourhood community in terms of impact and sensitising students to social issues and holistic development during the year

Punjabi University actively engages in community and extension activities, with its Department of Social Work and NSS Department leading efforts to sensitize students to social issues and promote holistic development. Under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, the university has adopted five neighboring villages to address societal challenges.

The Department of Social Work organizes various awareness programs. In collaboration with the School for Deaf and Blind, it held



exhibitions to promote awareness of hearing and visual impairments. Key initiatives include an 'Anti-Cracker Rally' (2017) with ASSOCHAM, an 'Anti-Begging Rally' (2018) with the Truck Union, and a Nukkad Natak on World Tuberculosis Day (2018) to combat TB stigma. Celebrations such as World Social Work Day (2018) and International Women's Day (2019) highlighted social work education and gender equality. In 2019, the department organized the 'Har Sans Swachh' campaign on air pollution and continued awareness drives on waste management and legal services in 2021.

The NSS Department contributes through campaigns on female foeticide, drug abuse, tree plantation, and road safety. Major efforts include awareness campaigns against stubble burning (2017-18), COVID-19 awareness (2019-2020), and volunteer participation in the 2022 state elections. These initiatives reinforce the university's commitment to societal betterment and student development.

## INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

### 4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The institution has adequate facilities for teaching - learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment, etc.

The University offers extensive infrastructural facilities to support its academic programs, including modern classrooms with black and white boards, ICT-enabled seminar halls equipped with smart boards, projectors, and Wi-Fi, as well as state-of-the-art auditoriums with a capacity of 100 to 1500 people. Faculty benefit from computers and high-speed internet, facilitating effective blended learning through platforms like Google Meet and Moodle, etc. There are laboratories in departments, of science, pharmaceutical sciences, biotechnology, and computer science that are equipped with advanced instruments like LCMS, RT-PCR, and spectrofluorometers that help to provide practical training. The 24/7 Health Centre provides free consultations and medicines to students, with additional healthcare services for faculty, staff, and dependents. Equipped with a digital X-ray, ECG, and a well-furnished laboratory for blood and biochemical tests, it provides efficient medical care to staff

and students. The Health Centre is supported by two ambulances that are available around the clock. Specialized Physiotherapy OPDs cater to musculoskeletal, neurological, geriatric, and sports-related needs, extending services to senior citizens and local hospitals. The Bhai Kahn Singh Nabha Library houses over 5.76 lakh volumes, 103 print subscriptions, and numerous digital resources, operating 22 hours daily with a 700-seat reading hall. Departmental libraries further complement these resources. Together, these facilities underscore the University's commitment to fostering academic excellence and holistic development.

4.1.2 - The institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, yoga, games (indoor, outdoor) and sports. (gymnasium, yoga centre, auditorium, etc.)

Punjabi University offers outstanding facilities for cultural, sports, and recreational activities. These include five auditoriums- Guru Teg Bahadur Hall, Kala Bhawan, Sunny Oberoi Auditorium, Senate Hall, and Science Auditorium -with a combined capacity of 2546. In addition to these there is an open-air auditorium for holding various events. The 16.89-acre Directorate of Sports, established in 1963, provides facilities such as shooting range, athletics track with floodlights, basketball and volleyball courts, football grounds, hockey fields, yoga hall, tennis-courts, and a multipurpose-gym. Two sports hostels accommodate 200 men and women each, supporting athletes with pre-competition camps, transportation facilities, and a strong anti-drug monitoring system. The University's athletes have achieved remarkable milestones. The University was awarded the MAKAT trophy ten times between 2005 and 2017. At the 2023 World University Games, India ranked 7th globally, with seven Punjabi University archers winning multiple gold medals. Harvinder Singh secured gold at the Paris Paralympics, 2024, while shooters Abhay Sekhon, Arshdeep, Jungsher Virk, and Prikshit Brar excelled at the FISU World University Shooting Championship. The University also offers a PG Diploma in Yoga, promoting practices aimed at natural healing and well being. Theatre and Television Department has produced over 100 plays, and is actively engaged in nurturing talent in performing arts. Open spaces on the campus host cultural festivals and yoga sessions, giving strong impetus to holistic development of students.

#### 4.1.3 - Availability of general campus facilities and overall ambience

Punjabi University's 388-acre campus in Patiala, is a meticulously and aesthetically planned institution offering extensive academic, cultural, and recreational facilities. The university has various regional centres and constituent colleges covering an additional 300 acres. The iconic five-limbed Department of Religious Studies epitomizes the spirit and ethos of the university, while the campus integrates academic, administrative, and residential buildings with central amenities like an art gallery, museum, library, theatre, studio, hostels, and a school. Utility structures, including health centres, gyms, stadiums, canteens, markets, guest houses, and a faculty club, are strategically placed, with a Gurudwara and Temple enriching its cultural essence. Academic facilities include classrooms, seminar rooms, laboratories, and departmental libraries. The Sophisticated Instrumentation Centre supports advanced research, while the 22-hectare botanical garden features endangered flora, rare plants, a greenhouse, and a medicinal garden. Based on Bentham and Hooker's classification, the botanical garden houses 450 species of trees, shrubs, and climbers. Zoology and Botany Departments maintain museums and photo galleries. The Bhai Kahn Singh Nabha Library serves as a knowledge hub and a repository of a vast collection books on all disciplines and subjects The Health Centre of the university is equipped with all essential facilities like X-ray, ECG, and ambulance services. Sports infrastructure includes a velodrome, yoga centre, and synthetic tracks. Residential areas, gardens, and a dedicated maintenance wing ensure a conducive environment for holistic development.

A detailed annual prospectus provides essential information about courses, admissions, fees, syllabi, library services, Personal Contact Programs (PCP), internal assessments, and hostel facilities. Learning material and prospectus are distributed through Learner Support Centres in Bathinda, Government Barjindra College, and Anandpur Sahib. Online resources, including videos on admission procedures, syllabus overviews, assessments, and examination details, are available on the Centre's YouTube channel and website for easy access. Students have direct access to teachers for academic queries via mobile, intercom, or in-person interactions, ensuring personalized guidance. WhatsApp groups are created for most courses, fostering communication and academic support between faculty and students. During PCP sessions, consultation lectures offer interactive opportunities for students for obtaining academic guidance and for discussing their progress. Social media platforms like Facebook and email communication help to provide timely updates and address student queries effectively, while text messages ensure prompt notifications about deadlines and other important events. Induction programs orient students to course requirements, learning resources, and available support, facilitating a smooth transition into their studies. Through these initiatives, CDOE guarantees that students receive the necessary guidance and resources to excel in their academic endeavours and achieve success

The University Library is automated using the Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) and offers digitization facilities. Currently, LIBSYS software manages key operations like Acquisition, Cataloguing, Circulation, Serials, and OPAC, with most services fully automated. A LAN has been established, providing OPAC access on all floors, and bar-code technology is used for books and membership. Self-check-in and check-out services powered by RFID technology streamline book circulation, complemented by a Book Drop facility and RFID security gates at the library entrance. The library maintains a CD/DVD database and provides Web-OPAC and catalogues on its website, which also hosts an informative library page with useful links. Wi-Fi is available throughout, and a dedicated Digital/Internet Access Lab caters to the needs of users. To enhance operations, the library is transitioning from LIBSYS to open-source Koha software. While both systems currently run parallel, Koha's catalogue feeding is nearly complete and will soon become fully functional. Links to e-books, e-journals, and other e-resources are accessible on the university network, and the library actively participates in DELNET and INFLIBNET. A separate ETD lab under the UGC-INFLIBNET program digitizes theses and rare documents using V-cradle and flatbed scanners. These advancements aim to improve efficiency, expand resources, and enhance the user experience.

Internet services, subscribed under the NKN/NMEICT project with 155 Mbps bandwidth and a capacity of 1 Gbps, are managed by NICI BSNL. Academic hours from 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM restrict internet

access to academic sites. The University's website, [www.punjabiversity.ac.in](http://www.punjabiversity.ac.in), provides comprehensive information and safeguards against fake clone websites. E-waste management adheres to Central and Punjab Pollution Control Board standards. To reduce costs, the University promotes Linux Distros, Free and Open Source Software (FOSS), and Open Source IDEs in departmental labs. Budgetary provisions ensure IT infrastructure modernization, including centralized updates for administrative branches, academic departments, and Wi-Fi expansion, fostering seamless connectivity and supporting the University's commitment to cutting-edge technology in teaching, research, and administration.

The Construction Wing Department of the University oversees a vast campus spanning 312 acres, comprising numerous buildings, classrooms, and laboratories. Led by the Executive Engineer, the department manages construction, maintenance, and landscaping activities with support from Sub-Divisional Officers (SDOs) and Junior Engineers. Annual Maintenance and Repair Estimates are prepared, with one SDO dedicated to repairs and upkeep. The department ensures the maintenance of buildings, civil works, electrical systems, water supply, sewerage, and roads. Repairs for lab equipment are handled by department heads or principal investigators, who may consult the USIC department for assistance. If repairs exceed USIC's capabilities, external agencies or manufacturers are involved with University approval. USIC operates workshops such as Mechanical, Glass Blowing, Electronics, and Optics to meet departmental needs. The University Computer Centre, supervised by the Director, manages personal computers and the campus-wide fiber-based network, while the Head USIC handles minor repairs for UPS, printers, and reprographic materials. Library maintenance involves shelving, cleanliness, preservation, stocktaking, and security. Playgrounds are maintained by trained staff who ensure safety standards, upkeep surfaces, and prevent vandalism through measures like fencing and alarms. This integrated system ensures the efficient maintenance of infrastructure and resources across the University.

The Planning & Monitoring Board at Punjabi University is responsible for implementing strategic plans, such as approving the opening/closing of programs and facilitating partnerships with national and international organizations for the benefit of students and faculty. Key functions include:

Punjabi University operates under the statutes outlined in the University Calendar and follows UGC rules and Punjab Government policies. The administrative structure includes several key bodies:

1. Senate: Reviews policies, suggests improvements, considers annual reports, and advises the Chancellor.
2. Syndicate: Manages university revenue, property, and administrative affairs.
3. Academic Council: Develops academic policies, ensures quality standards in education and examinations.
4. Planning & Monitoring Board: Implements strategic plans, approves program changes, and facilitates partnerships with national and international organizations.
5. Faculties: Comprise specific subjects and departments, publish textbooks, and design syllabi.
6. Boards of Studies: Frame course schemes, prepare curricula, and select teaching and research experts.
7. Finance Committee: Finalizes the budget and advises on financial matters and state funding.
8. Administrative Committees of Departments: Handle academic and administrative matters and ensure fair distribution of duties.
9. Selection Committees: Recommend appointments for teaching and research positions.

Additionally, the university has specialized committees like the Post-Graduate Boards, Research Award Committee, College Development Council, and Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), focusing on research, planning, quality assurance, and development.

### 6.3 - Faculty Empowerment Strategies

Punjabi University has established a structured appraisal system for non-teaching staff, while the performance of teaching faculty aligns

with UGC norms. Key practices include:

1. **Performance Appraisal System:** A multi-level evaluation process assesses the performance of non-teaching staff comprehensively.

2. **Promotional Avenues:** Teaching faculty promotions follow the UGC's Career Advancement Scheme, while non-teaching staff adhere to Punjab Government rules. For employees facing stagnation, the University offers promotions or higher grades after 15 years in a position, limited to four years before retirement.

3. **Welfare Measures:** Beyond statutory benefits like leave provisions, provident fund, and leave encashment, the University provides:

- Duty leaves for teachers to attend development programs.
- Orientation programs for new and existing office staff.
- Tuition fee waivers or reservations for employees' wards, based on income.
- A group insurance scheme for employees.
- Tie-ups with hospitals for healthcare services.

These measures aim to enhance staff performance, professional growth, and overall welfare, fostering a supportive work environment.

## 6.4 - Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

### 6.4.1 - Institutional strategies for mobilisation of funds and the optimal utilisation of resources

Punjabi University, being a state university, receives grant-in-aid from the Punjab Government, also mobilizes funds from tuition fees, affiliated college charges, and research grants from Indian funding agencies. According to UGC guidelines, the university maintains a fixed deposit of Rs. 1.13 crores, with interest used for computational infrastructure and the principal reinvested. Additionally, it has received funding under schemes like PURSE, VAJRA, and SAP in recent years.

Financial matters are overseen by the Finance Committee, chaired by the Vice-Chancellor. The Committee includes representatives of the state government and university officials. This committee manages budgeting, expenditure, and income. All the decisions are subject to Syndicate approval. For unforeseen expenses, the Registrar, with the Finance Officer, makes decisions, while maintaining accounts categorized under Current Account, Provident Fund, Gratuity Fund, and Endowment Trusts. Transfers from trust accounts require Syndicate approval.

The Vice-Chancellor can reallocate funds within constraints, avoiding liabilities extending beyond the financial year. Expenditures must follow established procedures, such as tendering or committee-approved purchases, with prior authorization from designated authorities. All accounts are pre-audited, and no expenditures occur without Government Audit approval. The Registrar oversees university property and finances, ensuring adherence to strict governance and financial discipline.

#### 6.4.4 - Institution conducts internal and external financial audits regularly

Punjabi University conducts internal and external audits to ensure financial accountability. Until August 2020, all audits were conducted by an External Auditor appointed by the Punjab Government, and pre-audit was discontinued in September 2020. The Internal Audit



Cell, established in September 2020, initially handled both internal and external audits for three months.

From November 23, 2020, auditing responsibilities were divided: the External Audit Cell manages areas like retirement benefits, promotions, projects, development, and Sixth Pay Commission fixation, while the Internal Audit Cell audits financial expenditures, refunds, and service matters across all university departments, regional centers and constituent colleges.

Income statements, including chest and cash books, have been audited regularly for the past five years. Financial transactions are recorded electronically through e-Office for transparency.

Audit objections are addressed by adhering to university financial rules, obtaining approvals, following purchase procedures (tendering, quotations), ensuring budget availability, and verifying tax compliance (TDS and GST). Local audits trace UGC and non-UGC grant expenditures before payment. Post-audit processes include verifying all cash book transactions and thoroughly auditing departmental purchases. The accounts branch ensures that audit objections are resolved following proper procedures.

The Women Studies Centre at Punjabi University aims to promote sensitization among both genders and foster a cohesive and congenial environment through curricular and co-curricular activities. The centre organizes various events such as seminars, lectures, and cultural programs to celebrate International Women's Day and conducts research projects on women's issues. It also runs workshops on gender equality, health awareness, and self-defense training for students and staff.

To empower rural women, the centre teaches skills in handicrafts and modern marketing techniques to promote financial independence. Gender Champions have been trained to support its initiatives, and the university provides equal access to facilities for female students, including a "24 hours Open Gates of Girls Hostels" policy, enhanced security, and a Shuttle Bus Service.

The university enforces a "zero tolerance" policy on sexual harassment, managed by the Prevention of Sexual Harassment Cell, in line with national laws. The Counseling Cell, led by a trained female psychologist, offers support, while a Day Care Centre provides a nurturing environment for children of female employees. Although the Day Care Centre was closed during the pandemic, it has since resumed services.

Punjabi University prioritizes sustainable waste management across various types. In solid waste management, it promotes waste segregation, recycling, composting, and proper disposal, collaborating with agencies to reduce environmental impact. The university also manages liquid waste with a sewage treatment plant (STP) that treats 1.4 million liters of water daily. The treated water is used for irrigation, conserving freshwater resources.

For biomedical waste, the university follows strict protocols for safe disposal, including incineration and adherence to regulatory standards. It also manages e-waste by a committee that ensures proper disposal through authorized services, maintaining records in compliance with the Pollution Control Board.

The university has an efficient recycling system, segregating and sending paper, plastic, and glass waste to authorized facilities for

processing. This effort supports resource conservation and a greener environment.

Additionally, Punjabi University manages hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste with strict safety protocols. Designated areas are used for storage, and trained personnel ensure compliance with regulations to minimize risks of contamination and accidents. These comprehensive waste management strategies reflect the university's commitment to environmental sustainability and responsible resource usage.
